INFS 6000—Required Software

Students enrolled in INFS 6000 need **Windows version of Office**, specifically Excel and Access (for the database assignment). Mac machines do not support Microsoft Access. If you are living in Colorado Springs, you may visit one of our open [computer labs](#) on campus to work on your assignments. You may also contact the College of Business IT Department at cobit@uccs.edu or at 719-255-3368 to request to connect to VPN and remote access a Windows Lab machine that is on campus.
