- Can discuss experience as a performer of Asian descent.




The Challenges of Ethical Casting in the Arts

- Work to fight against stereotypes
- Represent cultures accurately when portraying them
- Work to advocate for fellow artists who are underrepresented, especially if you have the means



Daniels Fund Ethical Principles: Trust

- "Build trust in all stakeholder relationships." Daniels Fund Ethics Initiative
- Show Asian performers dedication to diversity
- Work towards building those relationships and allowing them to trust that they will be represented accurately



Daniels Fund Ethical Principles: Accountability

- "Accept responsibility for all decisions." Daniels Fund Ethics Initiative
- Be willing/able to make mistakes
- Work to improve
- Admit fault and strive to grow



Daniels Fund Ethical Principles: Transparency

- "Maintain open and truthful communications." Daniels Fund Ethics Initiative
- Include unbiased reasoning in casting choices and be willing to share thoughts regarding casting plays/films
