


Moral Psychology Roots

- The interdisciplinary study of human functioning in moral contexts. Links philosophy, psychology, sociology, economics, literature, history, etc.
 - moral sensitivity
 - moral reasoning and judgment
 - moral motivation
 - moral character

 - Moral Efficacy
 - Moral Courage

Ethical Decision Making Terms


- Obligatory: It is not only right to do it, but it is wrong not to do it. An ethical obligation to perform the action.
 - Care for Children & Elderly
- Impermissible: The opposite of an ethically obligatory action, meaning that it is wrong to do it and right not to do it.
 - Murder
- Permissible: "Ethically neutral" neither right nor wrong to do them or not to do them
 - Plastic Surgery not wrong to have the surgery (it is not impermissible), but neither is it ethically necessary (obligatory)
- Supererogatory: Going "above and beyond the call of duty." It is right to do, but it is not wrong not to do it.
 - Picking up items someone drops, holding doors, helping someone cross the street



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Empathy, Good/Evil, & Character Development

Theory posits...

- Character and Good/Evil stems from development of empathy and neurological & biological processes
- "Empathy occurs when we suspend our single-minded focus of attention and instead adopt a double-minded focus of attention"
 - Baron Cohen
- Attention is a Spotlight





Empathy as a Scale

- Empathy Functions on a Scale
- High stress (cortisol) impact on hippocampus & empathy decline
 - Early stress can shrink hippocampus irreversibly
 - Reactive aggression
 - Amygdala fear response
 - Inhibited PFC to put the brakes on
- Genetic coding for empathy

- Epigenetics

Empathy and Attachment Theory

• Empathy

- Positively correlated with secure attachment
 Negatively correlated with insecure attachment
- Early secure attachment style linked to positive early moral development
- Gender differences in measured empathy
 - Link to....
 - Decreased testosterone exposure in-utero in males resulted in higher EQ scores in adulthood
 - Role of Oxytocin in increasing empathy




Role of Positive Psychology

Positive Psychology

- Study of what makes us THRIVE
- Counter-point to problem-centered psychology
- Happiness, Fulfillment
- Does not push away from negative emotional experiences
- Rooted in exercising strengths
- Actively and intentionally growing other strengths







Developing Empathy

- How do we do this with cadets?
 - Build curiosity
 - Experience inability to do something
 - Name emotions
 - Draw attention to care for others
 - ROLE PLAY Activity
 - Positional Perspective Taking





 If (Evil Person Name) expressed remorse and guilt for their actions, and accepted consequences/punished- should we focus on their positive qualities for rehabilitation?

"It is the only way that we can establish that we are showing empathy to the perpetrator, not just repeating the crime of turning the perpetrator in to an object and thus dehumanizing them. To do this renders us no better than the person we punish" -Simon Baron-Cohen







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
